The Petitioner states that when she married her said husband she supposed him to be of steady habits and correct demeanor - but who has since totally incapacitated himself to aid her in the support of herself and family. That she had at the time of her Marriage a comfortable living, but too soon did he obtain the controul of her property than he squandered the same in gaming and drunkness. That being reduced and having several children to maintain she was under the necessity of keeping Tavern, in which avocation having the whole under her immediate controul, she was enabled to procure for her husband and family a decent support. That shortly anterior to the expiration of her licence in eighteen hundred and ten she being unable to go to Cumberland herself, dispatched her husband having previously furnished him with Money to procure a licence - who instead of getting the licence as directed and as he promised he would do, spent the Money in drunkenness, returned home and informed the Petitioner that the licence was obtained and paid for - that relying upon the correctness of such information she continued selling as usual. The Petitioner states that if the said fines are exacted that it will greatly distress her. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fines.
