

Ordered that the Treasurers of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Jacob Brown Junior seventy seven Dollars and thirty seven Cents in full of his expenses and a allowance for bringing from the State of Pennsylvania Andrew Barnes a fugitive from Justice as per account passed.

Ordered that Robert Welsh of Ben be authorized and requested to proceed to Baltimore and make arrangements for the transportation of two thousand stand of arms stored in that City belonging to the State to the Arsenal in Frederick, to be delivered to the care of Mr. Nicholas King Armourer.

Ordered that the Treasurers of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Robert Welsh of Ben one hundred and fifty Dollars towards defraying the expenses which may be incurred in the transportation of the Public Arms from the City of Baltimore to the Armory at Frederick to be by him accounted for.

James Hunter was appointed a coroner for Anne Arundel County in the room of Cornelius Mills who would not accept and Commission issued to him accordingly.

Ordered that the Treasurers of the Western Shore pay to John Musgrave Esquire the Sum of two hundred and ninety nine Dollars and eighty eight Cents for Postage for the Executive Department from first of January eighteen hundred and twelve to first of April eighteen hundred and twelve.

By the Petition of Henry Wroten of Dorchester County it appears that at October Term eighteen hundred and nine he entered into a Recognizance in the Sum of twenty pounds Current Money for the appearance of a certain Matthew Quark at March Term eighteen hundred and ten. The Petitioner states that the said Recognizance was respited from Court to Court until October Term eighteen hundred and eleven at which Term it was called and forfeited. That at the time of entering into the aforesaid Recognizance he considered himself only bound for the appearance of Quark at the said March Term eighteen hundred and ten and that after that Term he believed himself entirely released. That under this impression he continued until he was informed by one of his Neighbours who attended Court in October eighteen hundred and eleven that his name had been called, ignorant what course the affair had taken and supposing it was not too late to bring the said Quark forward he accordingly at March Term last produced the said Quark in Court when he was informed that the Recognizance had been forfeited at October Term eighteen hundred and eleven.
