The Council met. Present the honorable John Stephen, Thomas W. Hall and
Reverdy G. Swelley.

ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Washington G.
Lusk the sum of one hundred Dollars towards defraying the expence of transporting
the arms from Philadelphia to Annapolis to be by him accounted for.

The State of Maryland to the Sheriff of Baltimore County Greeting.
Whereas Jean Francois Archard alias Archard is charged with the crime of forg-
ing a check on the Farmers and Mechanics Bank of Philadelphia on the
Mechanics Bank of Baltimore. And Whereas it has been represented to
us by His Excellency Simon Snyder Governor of the said State of Pennsylvania
that the said Jean Francois Archard alias Archard has fled from that State from
Justice and is now confined in the Jail of Baltimore County in this State, and
the said Simon Snyder Esquire hath in pursuance of the Constitution of the
United States and the Act of Congress entitled "An act respecting fugitives
from Justice and persons escaping from the Service of their Masters" demanded
of us that the said Jean Francois Archard alias Archard be delivered up to Mr.
Joseph Dougherty who has been appointed by the Executive of the said State of
Pennsylvania agent to remove the said Jean Francois Archard alias Archard
to the said State having jurisdiction of the crime wherewith he is charged. you
are therefore hereby commanded to deliver the said Jean Francois Archard
alias Archard, upon his being identified, to the said Joseph Dougherty to be remo-
ved to the said State there to answer the charge exhibited against him as afore-
said: and how you shall execute this order you shall notify to us with a conveni-
ent dispatch. Given in Council at the City of Annapolis under the Seal of the State
of Maryland the twenty eighth day of May in the year eighteen hundred and twelve
