The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of a number of respectable persons in habitants of the said County do remit nineteen Dollars of the said fine of twenty Dollars.

The Council met. Present the Honorable John Stephen Thomas W. Hall, Reverdy G. Huselin and James Mabb.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Jehu Chandler the sum of fifty Dollars and twenty five Cents for printing done for the State as per account passed by the Auditor General.

Ordered that the Executive will take of Messieurs Thomas Currier and Company of Philadelphia one thousand Napracks and one thousand Canteens. Napracks to cost one Dollar each. to be painted blue. with the letters S. M. and in all other respects to correspond with the terms mentioned in their letter of the twenty eighth ultimo. The Canteens to be blue and price forty five Cents each. The Napracks and Canteens when completed to be forwarded to Baltimore to the care of Nathaniel F. Williams Esquire.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Lambert Clayland the sum of one hundred and forty seven Dollars for freight of arms and so forth from Baltimore to Easton as per accounts passed by the Auditor General.
