By the Petition of Henry B. Thorn accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of Prince Georges County it appears that he was fined in two cases at April Term last and in one case at September Term Instant the sum of six pounds Current Money in each case for selling Spirituous liquor without licence. The Petitioner states and the same is confirmed by the Sheriff that at the last April Term he was committed for the fines then imposed on him and hath ever since remained in the custody of the Sheriff of Prince Georges County. That he is advanced in years is a cripple and is very poor and has a Wife and seven Children. That he is unable to pay the fines. The Board on consideration of the circumstances of the case and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fines.
