Thursday September the 24 1812

The Council met Present the Honorable John Stephen Thomas W. Hall & B. G. Hurst

Ordered that the Executive of Maryland will take of M^r Henry Deringer of the City of Philadelphia two hundred and fifty Rifles at fifteen Dollars and fifty cents each to be not inferior to the sample in his possession one hundred brace of Pistols at thirteen Dollars and fifty cents each brace and one hundred Horsemen's Swords at seven Dollars and fifty cents each provided the latter can be furnished by him. The Pistols to be equal in quality with those heretofore purchased by this State of the United States. The whole to be inspected and approved of by Captain Calender Irvine and to be delivered over before the expiration of nine Months from this date.

Friday September the 25 1812

The Council met Present the Honorable John Stephen Thomas W. Hall and Beverly G. Hurst

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Joseph Sands Esquire the sum of one hundred and thirty nine Dollars and sixty cents for furnishing the Annapolis Guards with Provisions and for other as per account passed by the Auditor General.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to M^r C. Jackson the sum of five Dollars as per account passed by the Auditor General.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to M^r Matthias Bartgion hundred and twenty three Dollars and fifty cents for printing done for the State as per account passed by the Auditor General.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to M^r J. B. Fowler the sum of three hundred Dollars to purchase Wood for the General Assembly.

By the Petition of John Fairbanks of Anne Arundel County accompanied by a transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County.
