

Friday October the 2. 1812

The Council met. Present the honorable John Stephen, Thomas W. Hall and R. G. Huselin.

By the Petition of Richard Fisk and Benjamin Horner of Anne Arundel County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that they together with Aaron Meeke entered into a Recognizance in the penalty of ten pounds current Money each before Francis Cromwell a Justice of the Peace for said County for the appearance of the said Aaron Meeke at Anne Arundel County Court at April Term eighteen hundred and ten to answer a complaint of Lewis Lucen. The Petitioners state, and the same is certified by the Clerk that the said Lewis Lucen did not come forward to avow his complaint before the Court. That the said Recognizances were forfeited at September Term eighteen hundred and eleven - a Month or two previous to which the said Aaron Meeke died. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said forfeitures.

By the Petition of Thomas Rawlings of Anne Arundel County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he entered into a Recognizance with Reuben White in the sum of twenty five pounds for the appearance of Isaac Walker at September Court eighteen hundred and ten to answer the complaint that should be then alleged against him. The Petitioner states and the same is certified by the Clerk that no such complaint was alleged, but that nevertheless the Recognizance was forfeited. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do release the said Thomas Rawlings from the said Recognizance.
