

By the Petition of Isaac Walker of Anne Arundel County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he entered into a Recognizance in the sum of fifty pounds for his appearance at the said Court at September Term eighteen hundred and eleven. The Petitioner states that he did appear at the said Court in pursuance of his said Recognizance, but not knowing that it was necessary for him to appear daily until a presentment should be made. he was absent from Court on necessary business when the same was declared to be forfeited. The Petitioner states, and the same is confirmed by the Clerk, that no presentment was found against him. The Board on consideration of which circumstances do remit the said forfeiture of fifty pounds the Court having recommended the same.

By the Petition of Basil Jefferson of Calvert County it appears that he was presented at October Term eighteen hundred and ten of the Court of the said County in five instances for retailing Spirituous liquors without licence and at May Term eighteen hundred and eleven he was fined the sum of six pounds Current Money in each case. The Petitioner states that at May Term eighteen hundred and nine he procured a licence to retail Spirituous liquors that under that licence he sold liquors for about nine Months. after which time a suspension in his selling liquors of about four or five Months took place. that at May Term eighteen hundred and ten he went to the Clerks Desk prepared with securities to renew his licence but the Clerk being at that time engaged in making some Entries by the direction of the Court, he waited for a more convenient opportunity, when the Court rising shortly afterwards placed it out of his power of procuring a licence at that time. The Petitioner states that his violation of the law did not proceed from an intention to defraud the State of any part of her Revenue, but from the circumstances above stated and the further circumstance of its escaping his recollection that he had not taken out a licence he not having sold liquors for some time after the Court had adjourned. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the whole of the said fine.
