Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Messieurs George and John Surice the sum of two hundred and fifteen Dollars and seventy eight and a half cents for freight of sundry articles belonging to the State from Baltimore to Annapolis and for the transportation of one hundred and eighty three of the Militia called into the service of the United States.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to M^r Andrew Sizer the sum of one thousand and fifteen Dollars and eighty three and a half cents for Repairs to the Stadt House as per account passed by the Auditor General.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Major Stephen S. Johns of Calvert County the sum of twenty five Dollars for freight on one hundred and thirty Stand of forwarded to him by the late Governor for the use of two Companies attached to his Battalion.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain Thomas S. Worthington the sum of twenty seven Dollars it being the amount paid by him for sundry articles furnished his Company stationed at Annapolis as per accounts passed by the Auditor.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to General Joseph Swearingen one hundred and fifty six Dollars and eighty five cents it being the amount paid by him for Knapsacks and for the furnished the Company commanded by Captain Thomas S. Worthington in the Quota of Militia as per accounts passed by the Auditor General.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to M^r Washington G. Tuck the sum of fourteen hundred and sixty four Dollars and five and a half cents Current Money for Salary as Armourer at Annapolis and for sundry Repairs to the public arms and for the as per accounts passed by the Auditor General.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain James Bragg twenty two Pounds ten Shillings for one quarters half pay due the first Insurrection.
