of Maryland agreeably to the Constitution and Form of Government proceeded  
to the choice of a Governor when the Honorable Lewis Winder was elected

On the Tuesday following and tenth day of the same Month the General  
Assembly made choice of the following Gentlemen as Council to the Governor  
to wit Benjamin Stoddert Alexander G. Magruder William H. Ward William  
Bond Martin and Walter Dorsey Squire

Wednesday November the 11 1812

The Honorable William H. Ward appeared in the Council Room and  
qualified before Gideon White Squire a Justice of the Peace for Anne  
Arundel County by taking the several Oaths required by the Constitution  
and Form of Government and Laws of this State and making and subscri-  
bining a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion and also by  
taking the Oath to support the Constitution of the United States.

Thursday November the 12 1812

The Honorable Alexander G. Magruder and Walter Dorsey appeared in the  
Council Room and qualified before Nicholas Brewer Squire one of the  
Aldermen of the City of Annapolis by taking the several Oaths required  
by the Constitution and Form of Government and Laws of this State and  
making and subscribing a Declaration of their belief in the Christian  
Religion and also by taking an oath to support the Constitution of the  
United States
