

on the second Monday in November and ninth day of the same Month in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twelve the General Assembly of Maryland agreeably to the Constitution and Form of Government proceeded to the choice of a Governor when the honorable Lewis Winder was elected

on the Tuesday following and tenth day of the same Month the General Assembly made choice of the following Gentlemen as Council to the Governor to wit Benjamin Hodder Alexander C. Maguider William H. Ward William Bond Martin and Walter Dorsey Esquires

Wednesday November the 11 1812

The Honorable William H. Ward appeared in the Council Room, and qualified before Gideon White Esquire a Justice of the Peace for Anne Arundel County, by taking the several Oaths required by the Constitution and Form of Government and Laws of this State and making and subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion and also by taking the Oath to support the Constitution of the United States.

Thursday November the 12 1812

The Honorable Alexander C. Maguider and Walter Dorsey appeared in the Council Room and qualified before Nicholas Brewer Esquire one of the Aldermen of the City of Annapolis by taking the several Oaths required by the Constitution and Form of Government and Laws of this State and making and subscribing a Declaration of their belief in the Christian Religion and also by taking an Oath to support the Constitution of the United States.
