

Ordered that the foregoing Proclamation be published twice in each week for the space of three weeks, in the Maryland Gazette Annapolis, the Federal Gazette and American, Baltimore, the Peoples Monitor, Eastern, the Federal Republican, George Town, Melcher's German Paper and Frederick Town, Herald, Frederick Town, Hagar's Town Gazette and Maryland Herald, Hagar's Town.

Ordered that the Clerk of the Council notify to Mr Addison his appointment as Member of the Council and request his early attendance.

The Council postponed the further consideration of Justices of the Peace and other officers of annual appointment till to Morrow.
