Friday November the 27/1812

The Council met Present His Excellency the Governor and the Honorable Alexander C. Maguider William Bond Martin and Walter Darby.

M. John Shaw having resigned William Ross of the City of Annapolis was appointed to take charge of the Arms and Military Stores in the public Arsenal at said place. Ordered that he be notified of his appointment by the Clerk. Notified accordingly.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. John Hopkinson the sum of five Dollars and twenty cents it being the amount paid by him for freight on a Box containing Swords from Philadelphia to Baltimore as per receipt filed with the Auditor General.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Henry Deringer of Philadelphia seven hundred and fifty Dollars for one hundred Swords purchased by the Executive in virtue of an act of Assembly passed at November Session eighteen hundred and eight. William Clayton, Samuel Smith and Thomas Wright of the Justices of the Queen Anne County, Benjamin Walker, James Maffey, Gideon Emory, Sam Bell, William Gilbert, H. B. Emory and Dan. C. Hosper Levy Court said County.

Saturday November the 28/1812

The Council met Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honorable Alexander C. Maguider, William H. Ward and William Bond Martin.

George Baer, Henry Kemp and Robert Cumming were appointed Justices of the Orphans Court for Frederick County and Commission issued to them.

The Honorable Thomas G. Addison a Councillor elect appeared in the Council and was qualified as such agreeably to the Constitution and Laws of the State.
