case of his refusal, Colonel Fitzhugh is requested to send them to the Armorer at Frederick Town,
and take his receipt therefor such of the Arms, as require repair to be delivered to the Armorer
at Frederick Town for that purpose.

The Council resumed the consideration of the appointment of Justices of the Peace
and other officers directed by the Constitution and laws to be appointed annually
and not having come to a conclusion postponed the further consideration thereof
till to Morrow.

Thursday December the 10 1812

appointed and commissioned Inspectors of Lumber for the City and County of
Baltimore

ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Nicholas King
late Armorer at Frederick Town the sum of twenty five Dollars for Months
Salary due the first Instant.

ordered that Mr. Nicholas King late Armorer at Frederick Town deliver up to
Mr. Jacob Metzger the Arms and other property of the State in his profession as
Armorer.

The Council postponed the further consideration of Justices of the Peace and
other officers of annual appointment till to Morrow.
