The Board proceeded to elect an associate or a associate Judge of the fourth Judicial District in the room of the honorable John Dorr appointed Chief Judge. The ballots being deposited in the Ballot Box. On examination thereof it appeared that William Whittington Ingrue had every vote. Whereupon it is declared in the Council that the said William Whittington is duly elected Associate Judge for the said District and Commission issued to him accordingly.

By the Petition of Abraham Hatfield and Thomas Kempfield it appears that they were presented at Washington County Court at October Term eighteen hundred and eleven for keeping a table of dice for the purpose of winning Money on the Race Ground at Williams Cove on the twenty third day of October eighteen hundred and eleven and was fined by the said Court at March Term eighteen hundred and
