Wednesday December the 30 1812

The Council met Present His Excellency The Governor and The Honorable Alexander  
C. Magruder, Walter Dorsey and Thomas G. Addison.

ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain Michael White,  
the sum of twenty one Dollars, it being the balance of salary due him as Armourer at  
Frederick Town from the first day of November eighteen hundred and eleven to the  
twenty fifth day of March last.

ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. William Rogers the  
sum of nine Pounds for services rendered at the Armoury at Frederick Town as per  
account passed by the Auditor General.

The Council resumed the consideration of the appointment of Justices of the Peace  
and other officers directed by the Constitution and laws to be appointed annually and  
not having come to a conclusion postponed the further consideration thereof till to  
Morrow.

Thursday December the 31 1812

The Council met Present His Excellency The Governor and The Honorable Alexander

ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Wells Lieutenant and  
Quarter Master to the troops stationed at Annapolis the sum of twenty five Dollars the  
amount of the accounts of Jacob Hawkes and William Guise for repairing Guns under  
authority from the late Executive.
