

The Governor submitted to the Council a Bond executed by William Richard for appointed Treasurer of the Eastern Shore of Maryland by the House of Delegates with Robert Lloyd Nicols and James Earle, as securities in the penalty of twenty thousand Dollars, conditioned for the due execution of the said office of Treasurer which said securities were approved of by the Governor and Council agreeably to the Resolution of the General Assembly to that effect, and the Bond ordered to be filed.

The Council postponed the further consideration of Justices of the Peace and other officers of annual appointment till to Morrow

Saturday January the 2 1813

The Council met Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honble Alexander C. Magruder, Walter Dorsey and Thomas G. Addison.

Ordered that the Armorer at Frederick Town, be allowed the sum of three hundred Dollars per Annum, for his Services as Armorer, and for receiving delivering out, taking care of and cleaning the Arms and other property under his charge.

It being stated that there are a number of old Muskets much in want of repair the Armorer is directed to repair such of them, as may be considered worth repairing by Messieurs John Hoffmann, Henry Steiner and Stephen Steiner of Frederick County, who are requested to furnish this Board from time to time with information of the repairs directed by them and the value of such Repairs.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Nehemiah Holland the sum of twenty six Dollars and thirty seven Cents for going Express by order of the House of Delegates.

The Council took into consideration the Appointment of Justices of the Peace and other officers directed by the Constitution and Laws to be appointed annually and not having come to a conclusion postponed the further consideration thereof till Monday.
