

The following persons were appointed Inspectors of Tobacco at the respective Warehouses in Anne Arundel County to wit at Pig Point Warehouse Gajaway Pinner. At Tracy's Landing Warehouse James Drury. At Taylor's Landing Warehouse David Stewart. At Beard's Point Warehouse Thomas Pindell. At the Indian Landing Warehouse Richard Gambel and at Elk Ridge Landing Warehouse Nicholas Watkins.

Commission issued to Thomas Pindell as Inspector of Tobacco at Beard's Point Warehouse in Anne Arundel County.

Ordered that Captain Thomas Conroy be furnished with sixty four stand of arms for the use of his company, upon his giving Bond with security, application therefor having been made by Colonel William Smith commanding the forty second Reg.

Thomas B. Tupper was appointed Judge of the Orphans Court for Queen Anne's County in the room of Thomas Wright resigned and Commission issued to William Clayton, Samuel Smith and Thomas B. Tupper as Judges of the Orphans Court of the said County.

The following Report and Resolutions relative to the claim of Jehu Chandler was taken up. The Committee of Claims to whom was referred the Memorial of Jehu Chandler have had the same under consideration and are of opinion that from a Resolution of the General Assembly of November 29<sup>th</sup> 1780 eight hundred and eleven adopted after the said Jehu Chandler was appointed Purveyor to the State, varying in some measure the duties of the Purveyor by which means the duties were enhanced and additional expence incurred and that the said Jehu is entitled to additional compensation they therefore beg leave to submit the following Resolutions.

Resolved that the Governor and Council in the recess of the General Assembly be and they are hereby authorized to adjust the claim of Jehu Chandler and allow him such sum as they may in justice believe him entitled to for any services he may have performed, or expences incurred, beyond the ordinary services which had been performed and expences incurred by his predecessor: and to draw on the Treasurer of the Western Shore for such sum as they shall award to the said Jehu Chandler.

The Report of the Committee of Claims, which accompanied the Resolutions in favor of Jehu Chandler states that the Resolution of November 29<sup>th</sup> 1780 eight hundred and eleven (Number 64) was passed after his appointment of Purveyor and that the
