

payment had been refused, he would have obtained relief in the Courts of Justice.

By printing the second edition of the Votes and Proceedings, because the Legislature said it was his duty the Printer acknowledged that his legislative construction of his contract was correct.

The Printer does not appear to have made to the Legislature any claim for printing the Journals and Laws of the Extra Session (June 1812). This subject of course has not been referred to the Executive. If it had been within the terms of the reference, the issue of it would have depended upon the practice heretofore.

The Executive, acting upon the resolution aforesaid is of opinion that the Printer to the State is entitled to receive for the extra services and expense imposed by the Resolution of eighteen hundred and eleven, the sum of two hundred and forty three dollars and cents. That an order be drawn in his favour for that sum. order issued accordingly.

ordered that Josias Green, be employed to print the testimony taken before the Committee of Grievances and Courts of Justice, relative to the Mob and Riots in Baltimore, and that he be allowed therefor at the rate of seventy cents per page, each page on an average to contain fifty lines. the work to be printed in octavo form one hundred copies the number to be printed.

The Board proceeded to the election of a Senator of the United States to supply the vacancy until the next meeting of the Legislature and upon counting the Ballots it appeared that Robert Henry Goldborough Esquire had a majority of Votes.
