

payment had been refused, he would have obtained relief in the Courts of Justice.

By publishing the second edition of the Votes and Proceedings, because the Legislature said it was his duty the Printer acknowledged that his legislative construction of his contract was correct.

The Printer does not appear to have made to the Legislature any claim for publishing the Journals and Laws of the Extra session (June 1811). This subject of course has not been referred to the Executive. If it had been within the terms of the reference, the Justice of it would have depended upon the practice heretofore.

The Executive, acting upon the resolution of a majority of opinion that the Printer to the State is entitled to receive for the extra service and expense imposed by the Resolution of eighteen hundred and eleven, the sum of two hundred and forty three dollars and ~~one~~ ^{one} cent, ~~that~~ ^{an} order be drawn in his favor for that sum. Order issued accordingly.
