

Braxton stands indicted and charged with high Crimes and Misdemeanors committed in the State of Delaware. that he had fled from Justice, and was imprisoned he was confined in the Goal of Somerset County, and under the provisions of the Constitution of the United States and Acts of Congress respecting fugitives from Justice has requested that he may be delivered to William Burton Sheriff of Sussex County and James F. Parker or either of them for the purpose of conveying him to the State of Delaware. This therefore is to require you to deliver the said Henry Braxton to the aforesaid William Burton or James F. Parker or either of them, and this shall be your authority for so doing. Given under my hand this fourteenth day of April in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen
