a Proclamation

In the present situation of the State, a meeting of the Legislature is thought necessary: Wherefore I have by and with the advice and consent of the Council appointed the third Monday of May next for the meeting of the General Assembly of this State: Whereof the several Sheriffs are hereby enjoined to give public and due notice. Given in Council at the City of Annapolis, this twenty first day of April, in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen.

Ordered that the Proclamation concerning the Legislature be published every day for the space of three weeks in the Maryland Gazette, the Federal Gazette, and American at Baltimore the Federal Republican, the Peoples Monitor, Melcher's German Paper, Frederick Town Herald, Hager's Town Gazette and Greaves' Paper, and the United States Gazette. The Proclamation respecting the Murder of John Plummer to be published twice a week for three weeks in all of the above Papers except the United States Gazette.
