

John H. Beall was appointed a Justice of the Peace for Prince Georges County and Commission issued to the said County including him.

By the Petition of Edward Bromwell of Talbot County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceeding of the Court of the said County it appears that he entered into a Recognizance in the Sum of forty five pounds for the appearance of a certain Edward Bromwell Junior at Talbot County Court at November Term last to answer to a charge for having stolen Wheat in his possession, the property of Anne M. Tilghman and Terich Tilghman. The Petitioner states that being in slender circumstances he reluctantly entered into said Recognizance and was only induced thereto by a tenderness for the feelings of his daughter, who is the Wife of the said Edward Bromwell Junior. That the said Edward Bromwell Junior hath enlisted as a Soldier in the Service of the United States, and hath thereby put it out of the power of the Petitioner to produce said Edward Bromwell Junior. The Petitioner states that his Recognizance has been forfeited and an execution served on him, which cannot be satisfied by him without bringing great distress on his family which is large. That as the said Edward Bromwell Junior will still remain liable to answer for said offence should he return to the State, and as the ruin of the Petitioner and family will be the consequence of an execution of the forfeiture aforesaid, he prays that the same may be remitted. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do release the said Edward Bromwell from the forfeiture aforesaid.
