The Board took into consideration the Resolves passed by the Legislature at its last session relative to the public Records and Papers, and under all circumstances thought it most advisable, and therefore determined that the office be again opened at the seat of Government. It is recommended to the different officers to bring back only such Records and Papers as are in much use, or to which they have frequent reference, the residue to remain at the Vineyard so as to be easily removed should circumstances require a removal. The officers are also requested to keep the Records and Papers brought back to the seat of Government in such a state that they may be ready for removal at a short warning. If practicable it would be desirable that each officer should engage Waggoners or Carts in the Town or neighbourhood to be at their service when wanted.
