

The Honorable Walter Dorsey having resigned his seat in Council. The Board proceeded thereupon to elect another Member in his place. The Ballots being deposited in the Ballot Box and on examination thereof it appeared that Samuel Oldent Lique had every Vote. Whereupon it is declared in the Council that the said Samuel Oldent Lique is duly elected a Member of the Executive Council of the State of Maryland.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the honorable Walter Dorsey the sum of twenty five pounds for salary as a Member of the Council up to this day.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Thomas James the sum of six dollars as per account filed with the Auditor.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William Ross Rummel at Annapolis one hundred Dollars to be by him accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Henry Deninger two thousand four hundred and thirty seven Dollars and fifty cents for sixty Rifles for five hundred of Bristols and one hundred Swords the Rifles to be paid for out of the twenty thousand Dollars appropriated at Annapolis eighteen hundred and twelve the Swords and Pistols to be paid for in pursuance of the Act of Assembly entitled an Act concerning the Executive to purchase Arms for the use of the Militia of this State and for other purposes therein mentioned passed at Annapolis on eighteen hundred and eight.

The Board met & sent this day to the Governor and The Honorable Alexander & Flaggwater, William H. Ward and Thomas Q. Addison.
