Mr. Shaw may proceed immediately to purchase one thousand Muskets if they can be had of good quality and not exceeding thirteen Dollars. five hundred Swords, if to be got at nine Dollars, two hundred and fifty pair of Pistols, if of good quality and to be had at a price not exceeding thirteen Dollars and fifty cents. five hundred Rifles, if to be got at a reasonable price. They have been purchased by the Executive at fifteen Dollars and fifty cents. five hundred Carbines, if the price is reasonable. Mr. Shaw will immediately inform the Executive, what purchases he has made, and at what prices, and what further number of any of the above articles can be had. Henry Devinger has supplied the Executive with Rifles, Swords and Pistols, and perhaps can furnish more as well as Muskets.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Alexander Locke seven hundred and twenty Dollars for one thousand pounds of Gun Powder furnished the Militia of Saint Marys County as per account filed.
