

G. Addison and Samuel Bidout appeared in the Council Room

Thursday July the 8<sup>th</sup> 1813

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honorable William Bond  
Martin, Thomas G. Addison and Samuel Bidout

Richard Harwood was appointed a Justice of the Orphans Court for Talbot County in  
the room of Solomon Dickinson resigned and Commission issued to William Thomas, John  
Meredith and Richard Harwood as Justices of the Orphans Court for the said County

George A. Harrison was appointed a Justice of the Levy Court for Kent County in  
the room of Unit Angier resigned and Commission issued to James Bowers, Edward  
Wright, Lewis Spencer, Edward Lubanks, Richard Graves, Thomas Hyerson Sen<sup>r</sup>  
and George A. Harrison as Justices of the Levy Court for said County.

John Craig was appointed a Justice of the Orphans Court for Dorchester County  
in the room of George Ward resigned and Commission issued to Joseph E. Muse,  
Henry Keene of John and John Craig as Justices of the Orphans Court for  
said County.

ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the Editors of the  
American fifty four Dollars for printing done for the State as per Account passed.

ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Musroe Esquire  
eighty five Dollars and three cents for postages for Letters for the Executive Depart-  
ment from April the first to the first Instant as per Account passed.

ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Benjamin Lusby seven  
Dollars and fifty cents for going on Express as per Account filed.

ordered that the Executive will take from J. Joseph Henry of Philadelphia one  
thousand Muskets at twelve Dollars and seventy five cents per Musket. These are  
to be delivered in six Weeks from the twelfth day of July instant and will continue  
to take one thousand Stand of Muskets every six Weeks till the order shall be count-  
ermanded. of which Three Weeks notice shall be given.

ordered that the Executive will take of M<sup>r</sup> Henry Deninger of Philadelphia  
one hundred Rifles with Bayonets at fifteen Dollars and fifty cents per Rifle.
