Harwood was murdered by a certain Charles Cox: and it has been represented to me, that the said Charles Cox has fled from justice, and it being of the greatest importance to society that the perpetrator of such a crime should be brought to condign punishment, I have therefore thought proper to issue this Proclamation, and do by and with the advice and consent of the Council, offer a reward of two hundred Dollars to any person who shall apprehend and deliver the said Charles Cox to the Sheriff of Calvert County. Given in Council at the City of Annapolis, this twenty fourth day of July, eighteen hundred and thirteen.

Cox is a Man about five feet seven or eight inches high, of fair complexion, light hair and eye, brows very little beard, and that on his chin (and that, white) he is very pigeon-toed in his walk: he has a down look when spoken to, his face is fleshy but not fat, his voice soft and effeminate.

Ordered that the foregoing Proclamation be published five times in the Maryland Gazette, Federal Republican and Federal Gazette.

Ordered that Colonel Richard Waters be directed to purchase fifty Tents for the use of the State.

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honorable Alexander C. Magruder, William Bond Martin and Samuel Bidout.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain Philemon Smith one hundred and sixty four Dollars and forty seven cents the amount of pay due the Company commanded by him for services in April last as per Pay Roll.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Sewell the sum of nine Dollars for Wood for the use of the Militia as per account passed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Nicholas Brewer Esq. Pay Master to the twenty second Regiment the sum of two hundred and twenty nine Dollars and ninety seven cents the amount of pay due the Company commanded by Captain Henry Woodward for services in April last as per Pay Roll.
