The Petitioner William Shipley states that he did appear at the said Court and that no presentment was found against him. He further states that after his departure from Court the said Recognizance of himself and security was forfeited. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said forfeitures.

A Proclamation

Whereas on the Night of the twenty sixth day of August last the Barn of Sebastian Grass Esquire, of Frederick County, was burnt down, and there is reason to believe that some evil disposed person set fire to the same: And Whereas it is of importance that the perpetrator or perpetrators of such daring outrages should be brought to punishment. I have therefore thought proper to issue this my Proclamation, and do, by and with the advice and consent of the Council, offer a reward of two hundred Dollars, to any person who shall discover the perpetrator of said offence provided he be brought to justice. Given in Council, at the City of Annapolis, under the Great Seal of the State of Maryland this twentieth day of September in the Year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and thirteen.
