

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William Jenkins eleven dollars and twenty nine cents for horse hire for wages and for the as per account.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Messieurs Grason Stull and Williams five hundred and fifty four dollars for eight hundred pounds of Powder purchased of them for the use of the State as per account passed and filed.

Thursday December the 16 1813

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honorable William Bond Martin William H. Ward and Alexander C. Magruder. Samuel O'Neil appeared in the Council Room and qualified before Lewis Gafraway Esquire a Justice of the Peace for Anne Arundel County by taking the several Oaths required by the Constitution and Form of Government and laws of this State, by making and submitting a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion, and also by taking the oath to support the Constitution of the United States.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Samuel Herrick two hundred and thirty nine dollars for clearing nine hundred and fifty six Muskets in November last by order of Colonel Richard Waters as per account passed and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Colonel Richard Waters one dollar and fifty six and a half cents for Powder and lead purchased by him for the State in August last as per account passed and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Aaron Phillips the sum of fifty seven dollars for the hire of his Wagon from Frederick to Annapolis and returning therefrom with the baggage of Captain Smith's Company of draughted Militia in May last as per account passed and filed.

By the Petition of Smallwood Cawood and Stephen Cawood of Charles County accompanied by a transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that they entered into two Recognizances in the sum of twenty pounds current Money each for the appearance of the said Smallwood Cawood at August Term eighteen hundred and eleven to answer a presentment and forsoth. The Petitioner Smallwood Cawood states that he did attend the said Court regularly until August Term eighteen hundred and twelve and that he did intend to attend at the said Term but was
