

Saturday December the 18 1813

The Council met Present His Excellency the Governor and The honorable William H. Ward, Samuel Bidout and Alexander C. Magruder.

By the Petition of Abram Shipley of Baltimore County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery for the said County it appears that he was fined by the said Court at September Term eighteen hundred and thirteen fifty dollars for assaulting and beating Abraham Odle. It appears from the representations of respectable persons that the said Shipley has always borne the character of a peaceable and good neighbour. That he has a large family to support and but slender means to do it with. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the said persons do remit the said fine.
