sixteen Pistols sixteen Swords and thirty holsters for the use of his Troop of Horse

Tuesday December The 21. 1813

The Council met Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honorable William H  
Ward Samuel Bidout and Alexander Contee Magruder

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain William H. Blake  
the sum of three hundred and eighty four dollars and nine cents the amount of pay  
due the Troop of Horse commanded by him for services in August last as per Pay Roll

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William Crane Pay Master  
to the twenty first Regiment four hundred and forty eight dollars and ninety three  
and a half cents to Wit John Lumby's account for ferriages eight dollars and ninety  
four and a half cents. Additional Field and Staff Pay Roll of twenty first Regiment for  
twenty seven dollars and twenty eight cents. George Wilson's account for supplies to  
the Militia and transporting Baggage six dollars and eight cents. Reed's account  
for supplies twelve dollars and eighty seven cents. Major Wick's account for supplies  
five dollars and thirty five cents. Pay Roll of General and Staff of the thirty third  
Regiment two hundred and seventy six dollars and ninety eight cents. William  
Crane for his services one hundred and eleven dollars and forty three cents

ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Richard Hall one hundred  
and thirty eight dollars and forty one cents for the hire of his Cart and Oxen and  
house rent for the Militia as per account passed and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Richard Hall sixteen  
dollars for Wood furnished for the use of the Militia as per account passed.

Ordered that the sword heretofore purchased by the State and directed to be delivered  
to John Davis for his gallant conduct off Tripoli be delivered to William Lusby Esquire for  
the use of John Mercer of Cecil County who is ascertained to be the nearest surviving  
relative of said John Davis pursuant to a Resolution of November 5. 1812
