Wednesday January 3rd 1793

The Council met pursuant to the resolution of the Governor and the Honorable Samuel Mifflin, Thomas Mifflin and Alexander Conner Esquires.

Ordered that the Sergeant of the House Joseph Hawwood Esquire Regiment two hundred and eighty one Dollars and seventy cents the amount of pay due the Company commanded by Captain Mifflin for services in and out last as per pay roll.

The Council resumed the consideration of the application of Justice of the Peace and other officers directed by the Constitution and having been appointed a committee and not having come to a conclusion postponed the further consideration thereof till tomorrow.

Thursday January 4th 1793

The Council met pursuant to the resolution of the Governor and the Honorable William Bond Master Thomas Anderson and Alexander Conner Esquires.

James Howard Esquire Justice of the Peace of Montgomery County and Commissioner of the said County were appointed.

James Holton Esquire and John Jones Esquire were appointed and commissioned Justices of the Peace of the County of Bedford County.

Friday January 5th 1793

The Council met pursuant to the resolution of the Governor and the Honorable William Bond Master Thomas Anderson and Alexander Conner Esquires.

John Wason Esquire Justice of the Peace of the County of Montgomery and Commissioner of the said County were appointed.

Robert G. Johnson, John Cummings, John Jones, Charles Taylor and Roger Brooke were appointed Justices of the Peace of the County of Montgomery and Commissioner of the said County were appointed.

Henry Jump, Elijah Safford, David Case Esquires Justice of the Peace of the County of Chester and Nathaniel Deane were appointed and commissioned Justices of the Peace of the County of Chester.

John Jones Esquire Justice of the Peace of the County of Chester and Commissioner of the said County were appointed.

Ordered that the Council meet tomorrow at ten o'clock in the forenoon at the usual place.
