Thursday January the 20th 1814

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and the Honourable William Bond, Martin, Samuel Bidout and Alexander Conlee Magruder.

The Council resumed the consideration of the appointment of Justices of the Peace and other officers directed by the Constitution and Law to be appointed annually and not having come to a conclusion postponed the further consideration thereof till tomorrow.

Friday January the 21st 1814

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honourable William Bond, Martin, Samuel Bidout and Alexander Conlee Magruder.

William B. Stokes, James Wallace, Thomas S. Bond, Henry M'Attee, Thomas Jefferey, Isaac Hollingsworth and John Cain were appointed and Commissioned Justices of the Levy Court for Harford County.

Adam Lunsford, Peter Green, John Ash, William Monke, George Hall, Walter Simpson, Thomas Marshall, John B. Moore and Jefe Hill were appointed and Commissioned Inspectors of Livestock for Baltimore County.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Peter Miller ninety four Dollars and fifty Cents for Oats and Potatoes furnished the Militia stationed at Annapolis as per account paper and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain Ambrose White sixty five Dollars for Holsters purchased for the use of his Troop as per account paper and filed.
