Tuesday January 25th 1814

The Council met. Present his Excellency the Governor and the Honorable William H. Ward Samuel Ridout and Alexander Conlee Magawda.

Ordered that the Treasurer at Annapolis deliver to Mr Brown of the House of Delegates for the use of Captain Simon Wickes's Company forty rifles four hundred bullets fifty tin charges fifty parkers and brushes three wipers and one hundred flints.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Jonathan Pentney Cashier of the Farmers Bank of Maryland nine hundred and fifty Dollars the amount of Mr Foxalls account for Cannon purchased for the use of the State.

Abraham S. Hayes was appointed a Justice of the Peace for Montgomery County and a new Commission issued to the said County including him.

Richard Harrington was appointed a Justice of the Peace for Talbot County and a new Commission issued to the said County including him.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Charles Browne Quarter Master of the 38th Regiment one hundred and fifty six Dollars and seventy six cents the amount of sundry accounts heretofore rejected but now papered viz. Daniel C. Hoppers account for Plank, Samuel J. Bammonsters for a spade, Bridgeway for a rope, & William Harper for supplies furnished Militia

John Woolfe was appointed a Justice of the Peace for Frederick County and a new Commission issued to the said County including him.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William H. Ward Esquire nine Dollars on account of Money paid by him to Isaac Willank for transporting arms from Philadelphia to Elkton as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Henry Keene Executor of John Keene late Quarter Master of the Extra Battalion of Dorchester County two hundred and fifty eight Dollars and seventy cents for supplies furnished the Militia in April as per account papered and filed.
