

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Bennell Gough Paymaster of the fourth Regimental Cavalry District one hundred and twelve Dollars and seventy one Cents the amount of two Pay rolls of Captain. I. Stonestreet for services in July and August last.

Tuesday February the 1<sup>st</sup> 1816

The Council met. Present the honourable William H. Ward, Samuel Bidout and Alexander Conlee Magauder.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Major General Winder one thousand six hundred and forty three Dollars and sixty three Cents for his services as Commander in Chief of the Militia of this State from 20<sup>th</sup> of April to the 17<sup>th</sup> of September last as per account papered and filed.

Wednesday February 2<sup>d</sup> 1816

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and the honourable William H. Ward Samuel Bidout and Alexander Conlee Magauder.

To be sent to Somerset County one piece of Artillery and ammunition

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Shaw five Dollars paid by him for the freight of one piece of Artillery and ammunition to Somerset County.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Edward Allen twenty Dollars for supplies furnished the militia of Calvert County in August last and for the removal of Arms as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Lieutenant Colonel William Smith fifty three Dollars and sixty seven Cents for services in April and May last as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Bennell Gough Paymaster to the fourth Regimental Cavalry District thirty four Dollars and eighteen Cents the amount of a Pay roll of a detachment of Militia Cavalry under the command of Lieutenant Daniel Jenifer for services in July last.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Tomatly Carrington twenty eight Dollars and twenty seven and one third Cents on account of supplies furnished the Militia in August last as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Colonel Samuel Huger one hundred and twenty Dollars for one more Round cannon and shot guns
