

By the Petition of Walter M'Conkie of Charles County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was recognized himself on the sum of twenty Pounds and two securities James Fowke and William Dent on the sum of ten Pounds current money each for the appearance of the said Walter M'Conkie at Charles County Court at August term eight hundred and twelve and good behaviour to Philip Thomas. The Petitioner states that the said Philip Thomas was an enlisted soldier under the command of a certain Captain Morgan who was engaged in recruiting for the army of the United States that shortly after the said Recognizance was entered into the Petitioner and the aforesaid Philip Thomas compromised their differences and that shortly afterwards and before the meeting of the court the said Thomas was carried away by his commanding officer from the said County. The Petitioner states that he did attend the said Court at the said term but neglected to draw the attention of the Court to the said Recognizance under an impression that as the said Thomas had gone off that no complaint would be alleged against him. That as he violated the Law from an innocent misconception of the Recognizance he prays that he and his securities may be released from the said forfeitures. The Board in consideration of which circumstances and from the accommodation of the court of the said County do release the said William M'Conkie James Fowke and William Dent from the said forfeitures.

Ordered that the Treasurers of the Western Shore pay to Isabella Nicholson three Dollars and ninety and one third Cents for furnishing Breakfasts for seven Militia men and and lodging for twenty as per accounts papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurers of the Western Shore pay to Richard L. Humphreys five Dollars for furnishing Rations for fifteen Militia men as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurers of the Western shore pay to Josiah Johnston Paymaster to the
