

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Jobb Fowler one hundred and sixteen Dollars and sixty seven cents for one Quarters Salary as Messenger of the Senate due the first of September last.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Thomas Harrison two hundred Dollars for one Quarters Salary as Auditor General to the State due the first of August last.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Thomas Rogers thirty seven Dollars and fifty cents for one Quarters Salary as Clerk of the Senate due the first of August last.

Thursday October the 13th 1814

The Council met. Present his Excellency the Governor and the honourable William Bond Manton, Thomas G. Addison and Samuel Ridout

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Larkin Shipley one hundred and twenty Dollars for a Horse belonging to Winsley that died on the service of the State of Maryland which horse had been valued at one hundred and twenty Dollars as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Larkin Shipley Quarter Master of Major Ridgelys Squadron twenty five Dollars and ninety five Cents for his services and rations in April 1813 as per account papered and filed.

Stephen Gough was appointed Brigade Quarter Master of the fifth Brigade.

By the petition of Charles Blake of Queen Annes County accompanied by a Transcript from the proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was fined by the said Court at March term 1813 the sum of two hundred Dollars for committing an assault and battery on the body of Samuel Smith. The Board on consideration of the representation of several respectable characters and that the fine was imposed entirely upon the testimony of the party assaulted, who had a civil suit pending do remit the whole of the said fine except twenty Dollars
