

Wednesday December the 16<sup>th</sup> 1816

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and the honorable Messrs. Haystack Thomas G. Davis and Samuel Bisson.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William Brown three Dollars and seventy five Cents for printing a card for the State as per account paper and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Vmash. St. George twenty five Dollars for printing a card for the State from the 19<sup>th</sup> to November the 26<sup>th</sup> eighteen hundred and fourteen as per account paper and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to George Baer thirty two Dollars and twenty five Cents for Cards furnished the State as per account paper and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Thomas M. Fowler Contractor for the fifth Brigade two thousand and seventy three Dollars and twenty five Cents the balance of his account for rations furnished the said Brigade from the 2<sup>d</sup> of June to the 17<sup>th</sup> of August as per account paper and filed.

By the Petition of Elijah Roberson accompanied by a Transcript from the proceedings of the Court of Charles County it appears that he entered into a recognizance before a Justice of the Peace with Charles Zement and Frederick Hardee his securities himself on the sum of forty Dollars and the said Charles Zement and Frederick Hardee the sum of twenty Dollars each for the appearance of the said Elijah Roberson at March term eighteen hundred and fourteen and good behavior to said his wife Louisa Roberson. The Petitioner states that through ignorance he neglected to appear at the said Court, that soon after the said Recognizance was entered into an accommodation took place between him and his said wife and all differences were actually settled. That he is old and poor. The Board in consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do release the said Elijah Roberson and his securities from the said Recognizance.
