

Tuesday, December the 16th 1814

The Council met, Present His Excellency the Governor and the Honourable Messrs Alexander Macrae, Thomas McLean and Samuel Stewart.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Jonathan Pinkney Cashier of the Farmers Bank at Harper's ferry two hundred and fifty Dollars the amount of his account and that under on the Government's account be filled up market passes furnished to the State as per account paper annexed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Major Nicholas Casley fifty seven Dollars and 99 cents for forty six Horses and more 2 cts procured for the Cavalry here by an order of the Hon^{ble} per account paper annexed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Thomas Warner thirty five Dollars for expenses incurred in going from Annapolis to the Topick Springs with some of the Records belonging to the Executive Department, to remain there to transact business for them and expense home as per account paper annexed.

Saturday, December the 17th 1814

The Council met, Present His Excellency the Governor and the Honourable Alexander Macrae, Thomas McLean and Samuel Stewart.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Fairwell Contractor one hundred and sixty four Dollars and 99 cents the balance of his account for rations furnished the 17th and 18th of August in June July and August last and for rations and forage furnished Captain Roberts Troop in the months of June, July and August last as per account paper annexed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Fairwell Contractor thirty five Dollars and 99 cents for rations furnished a Company of Militia under the command of Captain Fairwell in service of the State of Maryland in September last as per account paper annexed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William Taylor three hundred and twenty two Dollars and 99 cents the amount of his account for Gun Carriages as per account paper annexed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William Taylor one hundred and ten Dollars and 99 cents the balance of a former account for Gun Carriages &c. as per
