

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William Frost three Dollars for the hire of his cart to carry artillery to Bulltown, as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Colonel Thomas Humphreys two Dollars and fifty cents paid by him for carrying thirty eight stand of arms and cartridge Boxes from Menie to Salisbury as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Captain Charles R. Boyce two hundred and twenty Dollars and forty seven cents the amount of pay due the Company commanded by him for services in August and September last as per pay roll.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Robert Spedden Armorer at Boston eighty three Dollars and forty seven and three fourth cents as per account and vouchers papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Sheppard Johnson six Dollars for going to eastern for arms for Worcester County as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William Morris thirty Dollars for the hire of his wagon and team six days in conveying arms from Eastern to Snow Hill as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to James Colston twenty two Dollars and fifty cents for the hire of a cart horse and driver fifteen days as per account papered and filed.

By the Petition of James Ashbille of Washington County it appears that he was fined by the Court of the said County at March term eighteen hundred and fourteen ~~two~~ hundred Dollars for setting up and maintaining a device for gaming. The Board on consideration of the circumstances of his case and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County and other respectable Characters do remit the whole of the said fine except ten Dollars.
