Saturday January the 21st 1845

The Council met. Present his excellency the Governor and the Honourable William M. Wood, Samuel Redout and John Murray.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John M. Weaver Captain of the 35th Regiment one thousand four hundred and forty six Dollars and sixty cents, the amount of the following payrolls to wit. The field and staff officers;
