

with said bounding on said land North twenty three degrees and fifteen Minutes East seven Perches and six tenths to a large white Oak tree on the West bank of said creek, thence North thirty six degrees and thirty minutes East fifteen Perches to a post, thence North forty nine degrees East ten Perches and nine tenths to a post, and from thence by a straight line crossing said creek to the place of beginning, containing the quantity of twenty three acres, one rood, and twenty two square Perches of land, be the same more or less. The Council agreed to sell the States right to said land to the said Samuel Miller for the sum of eighty three Dollars and sixty eight cents.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the honourable Alexander C. Magruder fifty Pounds for one Quarters Salary as Member of the Council due the 1st Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the honourable Samuel Bidout fifty Pounds for one Quarters Salary as Member of the Council due the first Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the honourable Thomas G. Addison fifty Pounds for one Quarters Salary as Member of the Council due the first Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the honourable William H. Ward one hundred Pounds for a half years Salary as Member of the Council due the first Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Alexander Contee Magruder five Dollars paid by him to Edward Scott for procuring teams to remove the records of the State from Upper Marlborough to the house rented for their reception as per account papered & filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Alexander Contee Magruder eight Dollars paid by him to David Knawford for furnishing teams to remove the records of the State from Upper Marlborough to the house rented for their reception as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William S. Green eighteen Dollars and eighty nine cents the amount of his account for Planks for fitting up a stable for the reception of Major Ridgelys Squadron of Cavalry as per account papered & filed.

Richard Hey Watts was appointed a Judge of the Orphans Court for Montgomery County vice Thomas Davis Resigned and a Commission issued to Henry Harding, Thomas John Blagett and Richard Hey Watts as Justices of the Orphans Court for Montgomery County.

Yacques C. Bond was appointed a Justice of the Peace for Hanford County and a Commission issued to said County including him and leaving out William B. Stone.
