

Thomas Worthington Junior was appointed a Justice of the Levy Court of Anne Arundel County vice Matthias Hammond resigned and Commision issued to Jacob Fountain Junior, Thomas H. Dousey, Nicholas Worthington of Thomas, Joseph M'Geney, Charles Wades David Warfield and Thomas Worthington Junior as Justices of the Levy Court of Anne Arundel County.

John Wroth was appointed Surveyor of Kent County and Simon Wicks Senior and Commision issued to him accordingly.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Jeremiah Hughes nine Dollars and forty five cents for articles furnished Hall and Hunter for the use of the Militia for the same and for cleaning and repairing the Clock at the Government House as per account papered and filed.

By the Petition of Lawson Clarke of Montgomery County accompanied by a transcript from the Proceedings of the said County it appears that at March term eighteen hundred and five a presentment was found against William Ward for setting up and playing at a Table called a Faro Table on the information of Benjamin Morris and Richard Turner that after finding the said Presentment process was issued and continued against the said Ward until March term of the said Court in the year eighteen hundred and fourteen when the said William Ward was arrested and no witnesses appearing against the said William Ward he could not then have his trial and he the said Ward being in the custody of the Sheriff the Petitioner was prevailed on to enter into a Recognizance in the sum of two hundred Dollars for the appearance of the said Ward at the next term. The Petitioner states that at November Term of the said Court although no witnesses on behalf of the State appeared to testify against the said Ward yet in consequence of the said Ward not appearing the said Recognizance was forfeited. That Richard Turner one of the Witnesses on whose testimony the said Presentment was found departed this life in the fall of the year eighteen hundred and fourteen and that Benjamin Morris the other Witness in behalf of the State resided out of the jurisdiction of the said Court and is now dead and that no summons hath issued for any other person. The Petitioner states that he has a wife and six small children dependant on him for support and that the payment of the said sum would greatly distress him. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do release the said Lawson Clark from the said forfeiture of two hundred Dollars
