

By the Petition of Joseph Moland of Montgomery County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was fined at March Term eighteen hundred and fifteen for a Breach of the Peace in ~~two~~ ^{two} twenty Dollars in each case. The Petitioner states that he has uniformly borne the character of a peaceable and industrious Citizen and that this is the first instance he has ever been called before a Court of Justice for a breach of the Peace. He states that those upon whom the violations of the Peace were committed have never sought any remedy for the injury which they sustained on those occasions and that those who appeared against him in Court from a knowledge of his character and previous good conduct were actuated more by the imperious mandates of duty (one of them being an officer of the Court) than any sense of the injustice of his conduct. That he has a large family of small children dependant on his personal exertions for support and that the payment of the fines with the costs which have accrued would be accompanied with great inconvenience and injury. The Board on consideration of these circumstances and from the recommendation of a number of respectable Citizens of the said County and one of the Associate Judges of the said Court do remit thirty five Dollars of the said fine

By the Petition of John Parish of Baltimore County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he entered into a Recognizance with a certain Edward Parish in the sum of money Pounds for the appearance of a certain Joshua Parish at the Court of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery for the said County at September Term eighteen hundred and ten to answer a Presentment and Indictment for stealing a Coat. The Petitioner states that the said Joshua Parish absconded from Justice and did not make his appearance according to the tenor of his Recognizance. That a Case hath been opened therein in consequence of the forfeiture and that the Petitioner hath actually paid to the Sheriff of Baltimore County one hundred Dollars in part thereof which appears from the Minutes of the Court of the said County.
