Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Philip Dopey Thirty seven Dollars and forty cents for rations furnished Magazine Guard in Calvert County by order of Major Heems as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Solomon Geaves fully one Dollar and eighty cents for stabling for the Cavalry under the command of Captain Hall in eighteen hundred and fourteen as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Matthias Hammond thirty two Dollars for the hire of his Waggon Team and driver as per account papered and filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Colonel Richard Water Brigade Quarter Master at Baltimore seven hundred and ninety eight Dollars and thirty one cents for his salary to the first of January Instant and for expences in cleaning and repairing mules & mules as per account papered and filed.
