

locust tree, and then continuing the same line thirty two Perches and thirty six hundredths of a Perch to the beginning tree, containing three acres and one hundred and thirty seven Perches of land. And also that Parcel of land situate in Baltimore County on which Fort M'Henry is built, and the whole of the premises thereto adjoining the legal title to which was conveyed to the United States.

And the Governour and Council of Maryland in behalf of said state and in virtue of the authority conferred by the Resolve aforesaid hereby release all claim and right of Jurisdiction of the State of Maryland in and over said parcels of land, to the United States for the purposes expressed in said Resolve.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Washington G. Tuck one hundred and fifty Dollars for damages done by the militia to the Theatre in Annapolis in eighteen hundred and thutem as per account and valuation papered and filed.

The Council met. Present The honourable Alexander C. Magruder, James Shaw and Virgil Maxcy.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William W. Dunnington Paymaster to the 23^d Regiment seventy Dollars for services in paying off Militia to this day as per pay roll papered.

Benjamin Pindell was appointed a Justice of the Peace for Anne Arundel County and a new commission issued to said County including him.

George T. Webster, William Monk, Peter Fowle, James Norris, and Matthew W. Simmons were appointed and commissioned Inspectors of Lumber for Baltimore County.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Nicholas Brewer Paymaster to the 27th Regiment two hundred and fifty two Dollars for services
