

Alexander Downie was fined by the said Court at February term eighteen hundred
and thirteen the sum of ten dollars for selling spirituous liquors without licence.
The Petitioner states that in consequence of the poverty of the said Downie and not
being able to pay the said fine he was committed to jail and while there petitioned
for and obtained the benefit of the Insolvent law but could not be released from
Prison until the fine was paid. That the wife of the said Downie an industrious
woman with a large family of children to maintain solicited the Petitioner to release
her husband from confinement that he might nurse his children and thus en-
able her to work out and earn them provisions and clothes the said Downie being
diseased in the leg and not able to work. The Petitioner states that he paid the said
fine and costs to the Sheriff. The Board on consideration of the circumstances of

the case and from the recommendation of the said Court do remit the said fine.
