

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Bennett Gough Paymaster to the 6th Regimental Cavalry District sixty seven Dollars and thirty nine Cents in full for his services in eighteen hundred and fourteen as per account papers filed.

By the Petition of Robert Wilson of Anne Arundel County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was fined by the said Court six Pounds for selling spirituous liquors without licence. The Petitioner states that he committed the said offence from ignorance, that he obtained a permit from one of the Judges and was prevented from perfecting it by a licence by the sudden adjournment of the Court at April term eighteen hundred and fourteen owing to the then pending war, and he thought he might still sell under his licence. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fine.

By the Petition of William Adams of Charles County accompanied by a transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was fined the sum of six pounds each case in two cases for selling spirituous liquors without licence. The Petitioner states that he commenced selling goods in Charles County in the course of last year and among other things the retailing of spirituous liquors, that he procured from the collector of the collector of the United States revenue a licence and proceeded under that authority to sell and retail spirituous liquors without applying for or obtaining a licence from the state authority, that it was done entirely from ignorance and without any intention or desire to evade the laws of the state. The Board on consideration of the circumstances of the case and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fines.
