By a Representation of the Court of Queen Annes County it appears that Jacob Hambleton and Titus Holland entered into a Recognizance in the sum of Three hundred Dollars for the appearance of a certain free Negro called Thomas Coger who was indicted for felony. That before they consented to enter into the Recognizance they took a conveyance Bond for the conveyance of a certain lot of ground on Kent Island in case he should not appear at the next Term, that he did not appear at the said Term and the recognizance was forfeited. That upon investigation it appeared that the lot of ground for which the conveyance Bond was given, did not belong to the said Thomas Coger, that the said Jacob Hambleton and Titus Holland have used every effort to have Coger taken and have pursued him to Philadelphia and Baltimore and have been at considerable expence in hiring a man to take him up, that the said Jacob Hambleton and Titus Holland are considered to be honest and industrious negroes. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said Recognizance of Three hundred Dollars.
